

## DIRECTOR'S NOTE...

A beautiful, five-month-old girl (*pictured here*) is our newest arrival at the Center. This sweet baby, whose name is **Blessing**, is suffering from **kwashiorkor**, a virulent form of childhood malnutrition that results when there is not enough protein in the diet. It is most common in poor countries, where there is limited food supply and low levels of education (because people do not understand the importance of a proper diet). In Blessing's case, she was fed only corn starch mixed with water in her bottle, since infant formula was too expensive! This severe malnutrition required Blessing to be immediately admitted to the hospital once she came into our care. She has been there for almost two weeks, and will probably be there for another week or so.

***Right now, Blessing's condition is life-threatening. And because of your support for All As One, we can help Blessing fight for her life.***

It is not an exaggeration to say that your donations actually save children's lives. In the past nine years, most of the children coming into care have been on the verge of death. And several hundred children who have passed through our doors have survived only because of AAO's intervention. I've witnessed miracle after miracle. **On behalf of Blessing, and others like her, I want to thank you for your support.**

But, I want to urgently plead for you to continue, or even increase, your help now. We don't have a large reserve of funds in which to operate, and we are heading toward the summer months. This is generally a time when giving drops off as people go on vacations. ***During this same time, however, we face increasing needs for our services in Sierra Leone.*** Many of our new children will require hospital admissions, which are costly. The months of June – August comprise the worst of the rainy season in Sierra Leone, and living conditions for everyone worsen. The roads become rivers of mud that are almost impassable. Lack of sanitation means disease is rampant, and the already small food supply becomes even more scarce.



***We expect this year to be particularly difficult, as we are already seeing an increase in the number of children desperately needing our help. We want to continue to provide the best possible care for the children in care now, and also keep our doors open for the others who will need us in the coming weeks and months. But, we can't do it without your help!*** Please remember us this summer with your generous support – and don't forget to tell others about us too!
