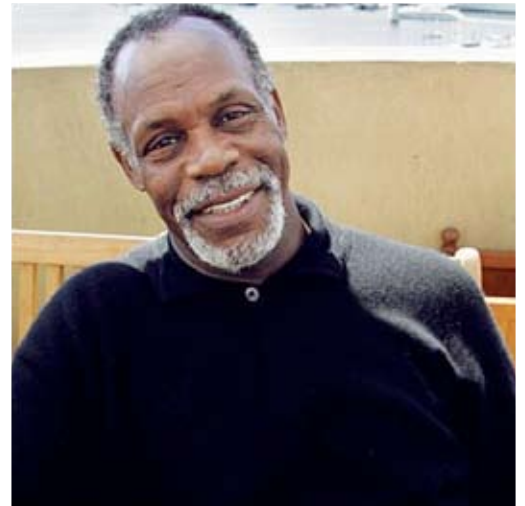

Making Progress to Expand AAO Services!

As many of you know, we have purchased six acres of land in Grafton, Sierra Leone, just outside Freetown, where we plan to build new children's homes, a community school, and a vastly-needed medical clinic/hospital. We have a plan to build this new community helping center in phases. Phase One was the actual land purchase, survey and conveyance of the land. **We have really been blessed by the generosity of our supporters, and have now completed Phase One!**

In Sierra Leone, if vacant land is not secured, it can be encroached upon. We want to ensure that this doesn't happen to us! **Phase Two of our plan involves securing our land – which will cost \$110,000.** Phase Two funding will allow us to erect boundaries, machine clear the land, dig a well to bring water to the site, purchase and convert two shipping containers into a small office/guard house and secure storage facility, partially fence the land with concrete block and razor wire, purchase a generator, and create/display signboards announcing our future development plans.

Of this \$110,000 total, we have just received \$55,000 from Omicron Electronics! Thank you so much to all those at Omicron Electronics, and especially Andy Hedgecock and Dina Leonhartsberger, who made this gift possible!

To clarify for our faithful supporters, **these funds are restricted to our Grafton project** and cannot be used to operate the current Children's Center, school, or clinic. So, we still urgently need operational funds while trying to raise another \$55,000 toward our Grafton project within the next three months.
